
EXPLORE 5 MILES OF TRAILS

Faith Rock Trail

American Patriot Andrew Hunter was cornered by the Tory Army atop this 50 foot blue stone outcrop (pictured above) in 1782, the midst of the Revolutionary War. Desperate to escape, he turned and rode his horse straight off the rock into the Deep River. Miraculously, he lived to tell the tale. On Faith Rock Trail you can hike to the top of this rock and stand where he stood before his daring "leap of faith."

This trail is an easy 3/4 mile loop that has a big payoff. Cross over the historic bridge, take in the beautiful views of the river, and go back in time from the top of Faith Rock.



RANDLEMAN





FRANKLINVILLE


Passing by the old grist mill and textile factory, the trail in Franklinville highlights the river's importance to industry in small town NC. The fine gravel trail journeys through Riverside Park, passes by Deep River Fabricators, and continues into a peaceful forest. Eventually this trail will connect with the Ramseur section via a bridge over Sandy Creek near the US 64 highway bridge. Combine this great trail with Faith Rock Trail (see back) and you've got a full day event.

RAMSEUR

The Deep River State Trail in Ramseur has two sections separated by the currently impassable Harlan Creek, where a bridge will be built in the future. The fine gravel trail on both sides takes you through a lovely hardwood forest with glimpses of the river along the way. On the eastern section of the trail you discover the remains of a dam, the site of the old Columbia Manufacturing Co. cotton mill first built in 1850.
